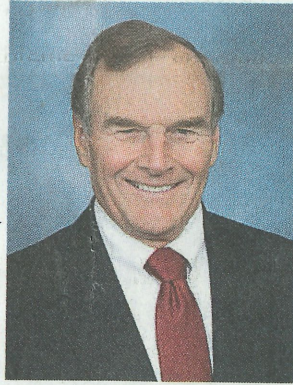


Steinbrecher Named Chair Of Bar Board

San Marino's Alan Steinbrecher was recently named chair of the State Bar Board of Trustees, where he will serve a one-year term.

Steinbrecher has served on the Board of Trustees since 2016 as a Supreme Court appointee. A litigator and partner at Steinbrecher & Span, LLP, he served previously as Board Vice-Chair, co-chair of the Board's Regulation and Discipline Committee, and chair of the California Attorney

Practice Analysis Working Group.

With the Court's current appointments, the Board has fully transitioned to an all-appointed Board and appointed Board leadership, a reform effort that began in January 2018.

"I am honored by the Court's appointment. In the last few years, the State Bar's Board and staff have achieved much—a refocused mission on public protection, access, and diversity, and the right strategic goals, objectives, and measures to make us accountable for achieving that mission," said Alan Steinbrecher. "We have momentum now, but

there's still much to do, and I look forward to the work ahead."

Steinbrecher will be sworn in to his new post today.

Before pursuing a law career, Steinbrecher served in the U.S. Navy as a fighter pilot during the Vietnam War, and later retired as a

captain from the United States Naval Reserves. He is an alumnus of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and Duke University School of Law.

Locally, Steinbrecher served as president of the San Marino Schools Foundation from 1999-2000 and was president of San Marino National Little League in 1998.

In 2010, Steinbrecher was named The Tribune's 'Citizen of the Year.'

Alan and his wife, Millie, have called San Marino "home" since 1985. Their three children — Greg, Katy and Lucy — each attended San Marino schools before graduating from Pasadena Polytechnic. All three went on to earn degrees from the University of Virginia.
